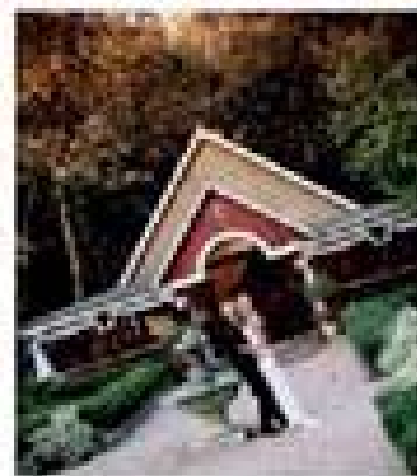


Bronwyn & Murray Corbett
